

## **References**

### **Text**

In the text, place the authors' last names (without initials) and the date of publication in parentheses (Braun 2008) or (Braun & Scott 2008) or (Braun 2008; Braun & Scott 2008).

If there are more than two authors please name only the first author and replace the co-authors with et al. (Braun et al. 2008).

### **References**

At the end of the paper, list all references in alphabetical order. If several works by the same author are cited, entries should be chronological:

Larch, A.A. 1996a. Development ...  
Larch, A.A. 1996b. Facilities ...  
Larch, A.A. 1997. Computer ...  
Larch, A.A. & M.C. Jensen 1996. Effects of ...  
Larch, A.A. & B.P Smith 1993. Alpine ...

The initials of the first name are to be placed **behind** the last name of the first author separated by a comma. The initial of the first name for the following authors are to be placed **before** the last name. The year of publication is to be placed directly behind the last author without a comma.

Last name, Initials Year. Title of article. *Title of Journal* (series number if necessary) volume number (issue number if necessary): page numbers. Town.

Examples:

Grove, A.T. 1980. Geomorphic evolution of the Sahara and the Nile. In: Williams, M.A.J. & H. Faure (eds.), *The Sahara and the Nile*: 21-35. Rotterdam.

Tappeiner U., A. Borsdorf & E. Tasser (eds.) 2008. *Mapping the Alps*. Heidelberg.
